**CONSTITUTION OF THE REPUBLIC OF SEYCHELLES**

*(Cap 42)*

**Constitutional Court (Application, Contravention, Enforcement or Interpretation of the Constitution) (Amendment) Rules, 2021**

In exercise of the powers conferred by Article 136(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of Seychelles, the Chief Justice makes the following rules —

**Citation**

**1.** These rules may be cited as the Constitutional Court (Application, Contravention, Enforcement or Interpretation of the Constitution) (Amendment) Rules, 2021.

**Amendment of Rule 13**

**2.** Rule 13 of the Constitutional Court (Application, Contravention, Enforcement or Interpretation of the Constitution) Rules is amended —

- (a) in subrule (1) by repealing the words “10 days” and substituting therefor the words “30 court days”;
- (b) by inserting immediately after subrule (2) the following new subrule —

“(3) For the purposes of subrule (1), “court day” means any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday.
